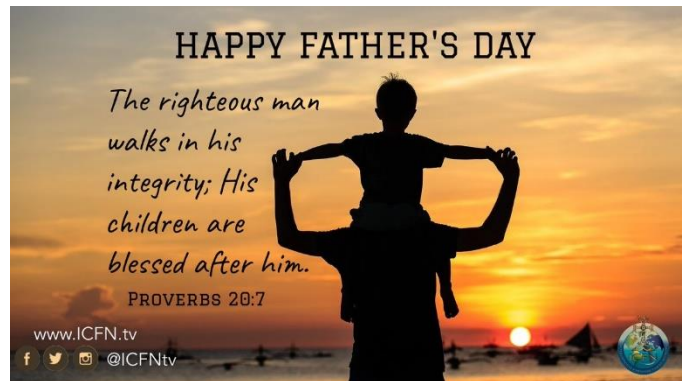

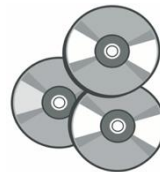

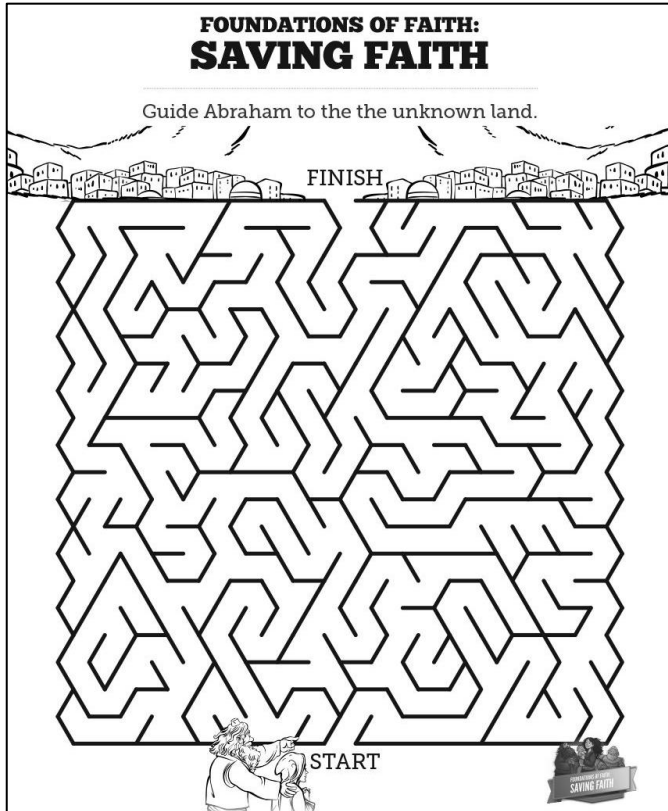

Ida Pearson Etzenhouser

Ida lived in Ontario, Canada and came in contact with the gospel through a neighbor lady. Her mother believed the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints was an evil Mormon church and she screamed and raged against Ida joining it. She burned the church tracts that were given to her. Her mother became so angry she would not stay in the house when Ida was home.

Ida left home when she was 17 and moved with her neighbors to Independence, Missouri and joined the church. Ida's mother was so mad at her that she refused to even say good-by.

Two years later, after her father died, her mother came to live with her and saw the error of her ways and eventually joined the church. She became a changed person.

Ida married M. A. Etzenhouser in May of 1904. They were both active in the church. Brother Etzenhouser was a missionary and she, of course, left her home and went with him to various places where he was assigned. While in Salt Lake City she and Bro. Etzenhouser revitalized the branch there.

Ida did an amazing amount of work for the church. In 1922 they returned to Independence, Missouri. Ida organized the Social Service Bureau. Problems of the church people and also people outside of the church were handled by this faithful couple. Neglected children were cared for, legal advice was given; there was an employment bureau that assisted people in finding work. Special attention was given to securing employment for disabled persons.

There was a used commodity shop where items could be purchased for small amounts. They opened a day nursery as part of the Social Service Bureau. The motto that this couple used in their work was "Help People Help Themselves". They stressed the idea of modern community chests for aiding the needy.

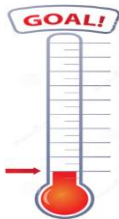

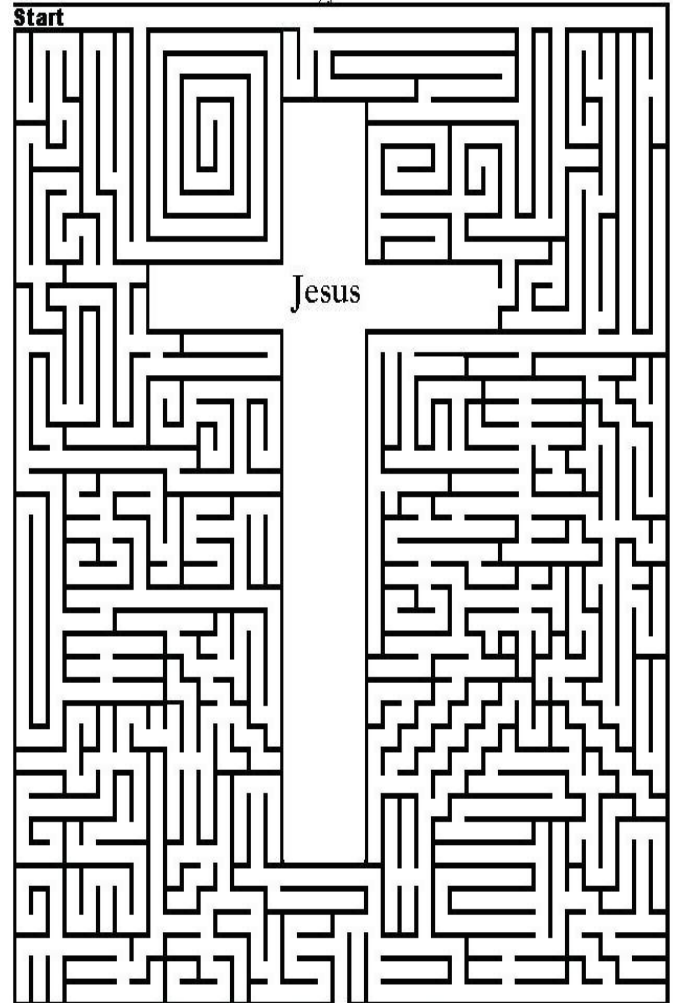

A Call to Action = Give Me Your Heart

*“And Jesus answered him, The first of all the commandments is; Hearken, and hear, O Israel’ the Lord our God is one Lord; And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength. This is the first commandment. And the second is like this, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. **There is none other commandment greater than these.** (Mark 12:34)”*

“Establishing our Hearts” assists us in fulfilling the above scripture in our lives. An “Established Heart” is centered in God. It is not good enough to just say we love God; our words must have action behind them. Actions such as = keeping His commandments, putting Him first in our daily lives, loving our neighbors as ourselves, offering a sacrifice of a broken and contrite heart, moving out in service to build His Kingdom, daily study, continuing in fasting and prayer, to name a few. ust as the most beautiful skies combine billowing clouds with shimmering sunlight, Henry Francis Lyte's colorful, bittersweet life contributed to the pensive depth of his beautiful hymns. Henry was born in Scotland in 1793. His father, Captain Thomas Lyte, moved the family to Ireland, then abandoned them, and young Henry was raised by his mother who taught him the Bible and instructed him about prayer. After he entered Portora Royal School in Northern Ireland, his mother died, leaving Henry a nine-year-old orphan with no means of support.

Portora Royal School was superintended by wise and kindly Rev. Robert Burrows, who saw something special in Henry. He invited him into his home, accepted him as part of his family, and paid for his education. Henry excelled. At age 16, he was awarded financial assistance to Trinity College in Dublin, and he traveled there intending to enter the medical school. But something was pulling him toward the ministry, and he wound up instead in the Divinity School.

By this time, Henry had grown into a handsome teenager, six feet tall with dark curly hair and a winning personality. He proved a hard worker, a brilliant student, and a gifted poet who repeatedly won awards for his compositions.

After college, Henry, 21, was ordained and began preaching at St. Munn's Church in Taghmon, Ireland, an inland city south of Dublin. There he made friends with another pastor, Rev. Abraham Swanne. When Swanne became critically ill, Henry cared for him and for his family, spending long hours talking to the dying man. The two clergymen realized they were both blind guides, lost, without adequate personal relationships with Christ. As they searched the Scriptures together, both Henry and his dying friend came to a deeper faith. He later wrote, "I began to study my Bible and preach in another manner than I had done previously." It was this incident that inspired his wonderful hymn, written in 1824 (revised in 1833):

*Jesus, I my cross have taken, / All to leave and follow Thee. /
Despised, despised, forsaken, / Thou from hence my all shall be. /
Man my trouble and distress me, / 'Twill but drive me to Thy breast, /
Life with trials hard my press me, / Heaven will bring me sweeter rest.*

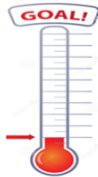

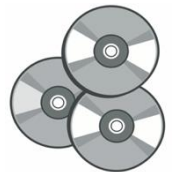

The scriptures tell us that God is faithful unto a thousand generations. Life's journey can often take some unexpected twists and turns. We never know what is ahead of us but of one thing we can be sure, whatever it is, our God will be with us. The difficulties of life offer us an opportunity to draw closer to God and express our faith by trusting fully in him. *Know therefore that the Lord thy God, he is God, the faithful God, which keepeth covenant and mercy with them that love him and keep his commandments to a thousand generations (Deuteronomy 7:9).* The earliest word for faith in the Bible was **Amen**. Strong's:

- Amen = in the Hebrew means = Faithfulness, to trust or believe, assurance, steadfast
 - Amen = in the Greek = firm, sure, trustworthy
- Amen is used in a double way throughout the Bible. When it refers to God and His Promises it means "Faithful" or "Faithfulness" and when it refers to our act it means "Faith".

Our faith is built on the "Faithfulness of God". Faith is our response to the evidence we discover of God's trustworthiness. Ruth must have seen evidence of God's faithfulness as she lived with her Israelite husband and her mother-in-law Naomi. Because she saw evidence of God's faithfulness she then chose to go with Naomi and make covenant with Naomi's God. She trusted the God of Israel and was not to be disappointed in her decision, for God richly blessed her because of that trust. **God is a faithful God, we can trust in him.**

And the Lord shall help them, and deliver them; he shall deliver them from the wicked, and save them, because they trust in him (Psalm 37:40).



*The Lord recompense thy work,
And a full reward be given thee of the
Lord God of Israel, under whose wings
Thou art come to trust (Ruth 2:12).*

Focal Point = Ruth became a chosen vessel because when adversity struck she chose to not only love Naomi but to trust in Naomi's God and believe in him and his faithfulness. The promises of God are true in all generations.

Ruth Chose to Love Naomi and Trust God in Adversity:

In our life's journey, we do not always have the option of choosing our situation in life, but we can respond with faith and trust in God. Like Ruth we can choose to be kind and loving. We can choose to believe Brother Kelly and Catherine dedicated their lives to the work of the church. He passed away in 1930 and Catherine followed him in 1944. our life that has not first been filtered through his hands. One of his Promises to us is that all things will work for our good. Ruth is a good example of this. All the adversity did indeed work for her good. *And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purposes (Romans 8:28).*

So Boaz took Ruth and she was his wife...and she bare a son. And the woman said unto Naomi, Blessed be the Lord, which hath not left thee this day without a kinsman (Ruth 4:13-14).

Ruth is a light for those who come behind her:

Ruth as a loving, selfless, faithful and chosen vessel affected other generations for good by her faithfulness. I believe we see her influence on her great-grandson David in the psalms when he says: *He that dwelleth in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the Lord, he is my refuge and my fortress; my God; in him will I trust. Surely he shall deliver thee from the snare of the fowler, and from the noisome pestilence. He shall cover thee with his feathers, and*

under his wings shalt thou trust; his truth shall be thy shield and buckler (Psalms 91:1-4).

Ruth moved out in faith and thus took hold of the promises of God: When we act upon our faith and **that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him** (Hebrews 11:6).

That word "assurance" in the Greek means = **Title Deed.** This means when we have faith it gives us the title deed to those things we hope for. It gives us title to the promises of God. They are ours to claim!!

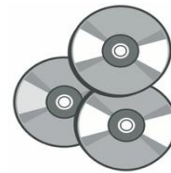

FOR HE SHALL COME FORTH FROM HIS HIDING PLACE, CLOTHED IN THE GLORY OF HIS MIGHT, AND HIS FIERY INDIGNATION SHALL FUEL HIM, AND HIS WRATH SHALL BE UPON THE HEATHEN; THEN SHALL THE NATIONS KNOW THAT THE GOD OF THE ANCIENTS, IS INDEED THE GOD OF ZION, YEAH AND THE GLORY OF ISRAEL, EVEN ISRAEL HIS CHOSEN. FOR BEHOLD, SAITH THE LORD, THE DAY SHALL DECLARE IT.

Karl then stated, in closing: It is my belief and understanding that we are now in the midnight hour! The call has gone forth. The bridegroom cometh, go ye out to meet him. Only few have heard the call, and many are without oil. But the elect, the invitation has been sent, to put on your beautiful garments, clean and white, and to come to the wedding. The Spirit and the Bride say Come! Even so, Lord Jesus, come.

My brothers and sisters, of the church, I hope by sharing Karl's message it will draw our attention

to this inspired message. Just consider, we need to listen and ponder upon His words. Too often we hear with our ears, but do not take God's words into our hearts to ponder upon

I Love to Tell the Story

1866

Then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory.
Mark 13:26 (NKJV)

William Wilberforce, the Christian statesman and abolitionist, led a fierce campaign in nineteenth-century England to eradicate slavery from the British Empire. The geographical center of the campaign was a wealthy neighborhood in the south of London known as Clapham, where a group of Anglican evangelicals lived. The "Clapham Sect" also advocated prison reform, education for children, and the expansion of missionary efforts overseas. Though lampooned for their efforts, they changed the world.

Arabella Katherine Hankey was born into this environment in 1834. Her father was a banker in Clapham and a leader in the Clapham Group. Early in life, Kate became involved in religious work. As a young girl, she taught Sunday school; and when she was eighteen she organized a Bible study for factory girls in London. (This Bible study was never large, but the girls became close and fifty years later, five of them met together at Kate's funeral.) When her brother fell ill in Africa, Kate traveled there to bring him home. That trip sparked a passion for foreign missions, and in later life Kate devoted all proceeds from her writing to missionary work.

During the winter of 1865-1866, Kate, thirty, became seriously ill. The doctors warned her to abandon her Christian activities and remain in bed for a full year. To occupy her time, Kate wrote a poem of one hundred stanzas entitled "The Old, Old Story." She began the first section, "The Story Wanted," on January 29, 1866. Later that year, she wrote a second section entitled, "The Story Told."

The following year, at the international convention of the Young Men's Christian Association, Major General Russell ended his powerful sermon by quoting from Kate's poem. It left the audience breathless. Songwriter William Doane, in the crowd that day, put a portion of Kate's poem to music, giving birth to the hymn, "Tell Me the Old, Old Story."

Another composer, William G. Fischer, set a second portion of Kate's poem to a musical score he named HANKEY, and thus we have this hymn, "I Love to Tell the Story." It was first published in an American hymnbook in 1869, and was later popularized around the world in the great evangelistic campaigns of D. L. Moody and Ira Sankey.

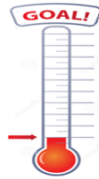

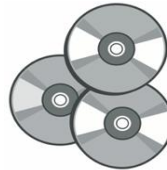

A Prayer of Blessing By Elbert A. Smith 1959

Recorded in Saint's Herald Vol. 106 #26. Elbert A. gave a special blessing to the church that included the women of the church; this blessing still rests upon us this day.

"Being alone in my home on a Sunday afternoon ... I felt the urge to indict a prayer of blessing upon all those of the church membership in need of divine aid and willing to receive it. I am persuaded that all who are so minded will have help."

"O God, our heavenly Father, most humbly I do beseech thy blessing to be upon thy church and upon the individual members of thy church, to each according to his or her personal need.

We dwell in the shadow of great danger which threatens all people. These are such times as the prophets warned us would come in the latter days when peace should "be taken from the earth." But with the warning went promises of blessings to all those who love thee and keep thy commandments.

Forgive us, Lord, our blunders and our shortcomings. May we from this time on serve thee more diligently and more intelligently. May thy people be blessed as never before with unity and good will, with light and divine guidance, for this is a time of great need.....

Bless those devoted women of the church who serve according to their gifts and talents in the branches and departments of the church. Thou knowest the needs of each. May their needs be fully met.

In an especial manner bless the women who are homemakers and homebuilders that they and their companions may build Godly and enduring homes from which may come the next generation to serve the church.

We were warned in the later day revelation that this was coming (see Joseph Luff's Prophecy and Doctrine & Covenants 63:9) and that we were to take righteousness in our hands and faithfulness upon our loins. And so it is, that we have come to the days of fulfillment, when God of heaven is beginning to rain down upon His enemies with justice and judgement. **We are called today to stand in Holy Places, and not be moved. However, says the Lord – when I would have richly poured out upon my servants, the oil of anointing, there were few to be found. Remember, Remember, that God is not mocked! Hath He not said, "Whatsoever man soweth, that shall be also reap?"**

If Ye have chosen fear as the seed of your planting, then fear and destruction you shall reap. If, however, for your planting you have chosen faith, then ye shall reap for yourselves a harvest of peace and blessings, and you shall countenance the light of Jesus Christ within you.

Nevertheless, His mercies fail not, and he is willing to forgive our transgressions, and heal our hearts of unbelief. Can you not hear His voice, saying, "Come and fall down before the altar, oh church of my choice? See if I will not open my arms to receive you." Nevertheless, many woes are coming. Remember the words of the Apostle to the Gentiles.

*Every man's work shall be made manifest; for the day shall declare it, because it shall be revealed by fire; and the fire shall try every man's work of what sort it is (1 Corinthians 3:13). **This is the fire of God.***

The patriot and hymn writer Julia Ward Howe first published in the February 1862 issue of the Atlantic:

*Mine eyes have seen the glory of the coming of the Lord.
He is trampling out the vintage where the grapes of wrath are stored
He has loosed the fateful lightening of his terrible swift sword
His truth is marching on.*

*I have seen him in the watch-fires of a hundred circling camps
They have builded him an altar In the evening dews and damps
I have read his righteous sentence by the dim and flaring lamps
His truth is marching on.*

*He has sounded forth the trumpet that shall never call retreat
He is sifting out the hearts of men before His judgment-seat
Oh, be swift, my soul to answer, oh be jubilant, my feet,
His truth is marching on.*

*In the beauty of the lilies Christ was born across the sea
With a glory of his bosom that transfigures you and me
As he died to make men holy let us die to make men free

John Ernest Bode was an Anglican clergyman serving a small parish near Cambridge, England when his three children, a daughter and two sons, were ready for confirmation. Bode not only presided over their confirmation, but also wrote this hymn especially for the occasion—telling the children that the hymn included “all the important truths I want you to remember.

The hymn was originally, “O Jesus, We Have Promised—in view of the fact that more than one child was involved in the confirmation. Changed to “O Jesus, I Have Promised,” it serves as a fitting hymn of commitment for every Christian. It not only reminds us of the promises that we have made to Jesus, but it also asks Jesus to protect us from the dangers and temptations posed by the world—and it reminds us that Jesus has made promises too—that Jesus promised that we will live with him in glory.

We don't know what hymn tune Bode used in that confirmation service. The tune with which we are familiar was written later by Arthur H. Mann, the organist at King's College Chapel in Cambridge for fifty-three years.

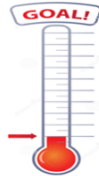

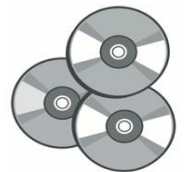

Crown Him with Many Crowns

1851

... and on His head were many crowns ... Revelation 19:12

The original form of this hymn was written by Matthew Bridges and consisted of six eight-line stanzas. He thought of his hymn as a sermon in song, based on Revelation 19:12. "... and on His head were many crowns." He called his hymn, "The Song of the Seraphs." Matthew, who once wrote a book condemning Roman Catholics, ended up converting to Catholicism in 1848. He followed John Henry Newman out of the Church of England.

In 1874, Godfrey Thring, a staunch Anglican clergyman feared that some of Bridges' verses smacked too much of Catholic doctrine. Verse two, for example, said:

*Crown Him the virgin's Son, the God incarnate born,
 Whose arm those crimson trophies won which now His brow adorn;
 Fruit of the mystic rose, as of that rose the stem;
 The root whence mercy ever flows, the Babe of Bethlehem.*

It seems odd to us now that such a verse would cause controversy, but in the end Godfrey wrote six new verses for the same song. "Crown Him with Many Crowns," therefore became a six-verse hymn that was written twice!

Over the years, these twelve stanzas have become intermingled in the hymn-books, with editors mixing and matching the verses. Here are the first lines of all twelve verses, the first six by Bridges, the last six by Thring:

- Stanza 1: *Crown Him with many crowns, the Lamb upon His throne ...*
- Stanza 2: *Crown Him the virgin's Son, the God incarnate born ...*
- Stanza 3: *Crown Him the Lord of love, behold His hands and side ...*
- Stanza 4: *Crown Him the Lord of peace, Whose power a scepter sways ...*
- Stanza 5: *Crown Him the Lord of years, the Potentate of time,*
- Stanza 6: *Crown Him the Lord of Heaven, one with the Father known ...*
- Stanza 7: *Crown Him with crowns of gold ...*
- Stanza 8: *Crown Him the Son of God, before the worlds began ...*
- Stanza 9: *Crown Him the Lord of light ...*
- Stanza 10: *Crown Him the Lord of life, who triumphed over the grave ...*
- Stanza 11: *Crown Him the Lord of lords, who over all doth reign ...*
- Stanza 12: *Crown Him the Lord of heaven, enthroned in worlds above ...*
